A New Strategic Focus:

United in Helping Children and Families Thrive

In January, United Way of Trumbull County announced a new strategic focus that will support our vision of inspiring and building a community where everyone has the opportunity to reach their full potential. We are following the lead of **United Way Worldwide** and the trends of United Ways across the country by moving away from investing in a broad array of social services to a more focused group of programs and services. Moving forward, we will make funding decisions that specifically focus on helping families living in poverty or who are living below the threshold to afford the basics.

After two years of research and a survey of the community, three new areas of focus emerged:

1. Learn Well – Our goal is to provide quality educational programs for children ages 0-18 or through graduation. Our research has revealed the need for improvements in literacy, pre-kindergarten readiness, and preparation for 21st century jobs. United Way of Trumbull County's Reading Great by 8 literacy initiative will be an important part of our Learn Well focus.

2. Earn Well – The purpose of this new focus area is to help individuals be prepared for jobs and to maintain jobs, gain financial literacy, manage limited resources, and have access to health care including drug prevention and rehabilitation. Financial education programs and free tax preparation will continue to be offered through our Trumbull County Partnership for Financial Empowerment initiative.

3. Stay Well – Ensuring basic needs and emergency services are available when life doesn't go as planned is at the foundation of all our work. United Way of Trumbull County will continue to fund programs in these areas.

Community Volunteers Celebrate and “Read 4 Fun” on Dr. Seuss Day

On March 2nd, Read Across America Day, more than 100 community volunteers, partners and local officials participated in United Way of Trumbull County’s **Read 4 Fun** program by celebrating the beloved children’s author Dr. Seuss and other select authors chosen by **Warren City School Literacy Coaches**. The guest readers visited 208 classrooms in 16 **Trumbull County School Districts**, where they read a book aloud, shared laughs, hugs, and high-fives with nearly 4,700 students in grades K-2.

Many of the volunteers arrived at the classrooms in full Dr. Seuss attire; fluffy blue wigs that mimicked Thing 1 and Thing 2, and the Cat in the Hat’s notorious red and white striped stove-pipe hat. Others brought in fun props, rhyming flash cards, and book markers, exemplifying their joy of reading. While this event is designed to spark the imagination of the students, volunteers left the classrooms feeling just as engaged.

“Having a guest readers come into the schools allows the students to listen on a higher language level than they may be able to read. It also exposes the students to vocabulary and language patters, such as the silliness of the couplets, rhymes, and nonsense words found in Dr. Seuss’ books that helps to strengthen a child’s phonological ability,” states Ginny Pasha, President and CEO of United Way of Trumbull County.

Read 4 Fun is one of three programs under UWTC’s Reading Great by 8 Literacy Initiative. The program, designed to engage K-2 students, focuses on creating fun reading experiences and

improving early readers’ language and cognitive skills. This goal for this program is to motivate young readers to “**Read 4 Fun**”.

United Way’s **Read 4 Fun** program is held twice a year; on Dr. Seuss Day and again during the fall, thanks to the help of our guest readers and volunteers.

The partnering school districts included the following: **Badger, Bloomfield, Bristol, Brookfield, Champion, Hubbard, LaBrae, Lakeview, Liberty, Lordstown, Maplewood, Mathews, Newton Falls, Niles, Warren, and Weathersfield.**

The Women's Auxiliary donates \$50,000 to Women United for their Diabetes Initiative

When Women United launched late in 2018, it didn't take the members long to decide on a signature focus. **Pam Marshall**, chairperson for the group and Physician's Liaison for **Trumbull Regional Medical Center (TRMC)**, introduced **Linda Tominey**, the Diabetes Coordinator at TRMC. Linda made a compelling argument for the need to help people here in our community manage diabetes. The decision to focus on the diabetes epidemic here in Trumbull County was an easy one.

Since there were no funds earmarked for this new endeavor, **Women United in Trumbull County** decided to start by raising awareness and aggregating all the available resources together to make it easier for those struggling to find help. We would address the cost of insulin and other ways to manage diabetes once funds were raised.

However, funds came even more quickly than originally

hoped! Thanks to the ladies at the **Gift Shop at Trumbull Regional Medical Center** we can begin ahead of schedule and people will get the help they need. An initial gift of \$25,000 will be provided now and second gift of \$25,000 will be donated in September of 2019.

Family & Community Services seeks to Strengthen, Empower and Enrich the Lives of Individuals and Families through a Broad Continuum of Services



Family & Community Services, Inc. has been assisting individuals of all ages for the past 75 years. Of the 71 programs they house in Ohio and Michigan, United Way provides funding to their **Foster Grandparents** program, **Scope Senior Support Services**, the **Solace Center**, and their **Someplace Safe** programs in Trumbull County.

Last year, **Family & Community Services** assisted well over 100,000 individuals that included clients from infants to senior citizens, by providing food, clothing, shelter, counseling and other services.

Their action outcomes strive towards attaining a high-level of dignity and satisfaction for their clients, developing innovative partnerships such as the one they have with **United Way of Trumbull County**, and promoting volunteerism, all while maintaining a strong financial position.

Niles Community Services; meeting the needs of the people in Niles, Mineral Ridge, McDonald and Weathersfield



Niles Community Services has been providing assistance to financially disadvantaged residents of Niles, Mineral Ridge, McDonald and Weathersfield Township since 1923.

Their Basic Needs services includes a USDA Food Pantry; assistance with medical and prescription fees, shelter, gas cards, utilities; professional and everyday clothing; as well as providing diapers and baby items for families with newborns and toddlers. Niles Community Services also serves a satellite office for HEAP, the Home Energy Assistance Program.

United Way of Trumbull County is a proud partner of **Niles Community Services** and provides funding to assist with their Basic Needs services. Currently, the agency provides assistance to nearly 350 families each month.

Niles Community Services is one of several **Local Food Pantries** that benefit from the **National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC)** "Stamp Out Hunger" **Food Drive**, taking place on Saturday, May 11th. This drive encourages **NALC** customers to donate and place non-perishable food items in a bag by their mailbox. The letter carriers will then collect the food to be sorted and distributed directly to **Local Food Pantries** from the community in which they were received.

Following the "Stamp Our Hunger" **Food Drive**, is the "Can the Cruiser" **Food Drive** on Sunday, June 2nd, hosted by the **Trumbull Post of the Ohio State Highway Patrol**. State troopers will collect non-perishable food items and canned goods at **Sparkle Market** and **Macali's Giant Eagle** in Niles from 10 am until 2 pm to benefit **Niles Community Services**. Area residents are encouraged to participate.
